We can't wait for our exciting annual Go-Kart Race-a historic event that has long been a source of pride for SAIPS and a highlight for our community. Sofia & Chayne

What do you want to be when you grow up?

Sofia: I want to follow my mum's footsteps and become a teacher because I will enjoy teaching other students.

Chayne: I went to South Africa on an aeroplane, and since then, I've wanted to become a pilot because I love to fly.



If two people are fighting, how would you help them?

Sofia :

Creative Spellers at Work!








